17	Plaintiff Autodesk, Inc. and defendant Open Design Alliance jointly move the Court	
18	for a 30-day stay of these proceedings so that they may complete their ongoing settlement	
19	discussions without incurring potentially unnecessary litigation costs and without wasting	
20	judicial resources.	
21	On November 22, 2006, the Court granted Autodesk's motion for a temporary	
22	restraining order. Since that time, the parties have met and conferred regarding expedited	
23	discovery, and Autodesk has filed its opening brief in support of its motion for a preliminary	

injunction. However, the parties' efforts and resources have been predominantly devoted to

resolving this dispute without resort to further litigation. These ongoing negotiations, which

have taken time due to the number and location of entities and individuals involved, have

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been productive. The parties are now in the process of drafting final settlement documents and are optimistic that this will resolve the matter with finality.

In making this joint motion, the parties remain mindful of the Court's desire to keep this and all matters before it on a timely schedule. The parties respectfully make this request, however, so that they may give the appropriate attention and resources to attempting to complete the settlement without concurrently litigating the underlying dispute. If the parties' efforts are unsuccessful at the conclusion of the stay, the parties will immediately advise the Court and propose a new schedule for the responsive pleading to the Counterclaims, the remaining briefing on the preliminary injunction motion, the Show Cause Hearing referenced in paragraph 5 of the Court's November 22, 2006 Temporary Restraining Order, and the parties' discovery obligations.

For all these reasons, the parties respectfully request this Court to exercise its inherent power to manage and control its docket by staying proceedings in this action for a period of 30 days. A proposed order consistent with this agreed motion is set forth below.
