Walters and Stephen M. Nowlis (Dkt. # 16 83). NPI did not mark the documents as confidential and files this motion pursuant to its 17 obligations in the stipulated protective order ("Protective Order") approved by this court 18 on July 17, 2008. NPI therefore is unable to represent to the court that there is a 19 compelling reason to seal the exhibits. (See Mot. at 3; Declaration of Mark P. Walters 20 (Dkt. #84) ¶3.) Defendant Gamber-Johnson LLC ("Gamber-Johnson") does not oppose 21 22

the motion and responds that the exhibits do contain confidential information and should remain sealed. (Resp. (Dkt. # 108) at 4.)

Pursuant to Local Rule 5(g), there is a strong presumption of public access to the

court's files. Local Rules W.D. Wash. CR 5(g). With respect to dispositive motions, such as the motion before the court in this case, the presumption can only be overcome with a "compelling showing that the public's right of access is outweighed by the interests of the public and the parties in protecting the court's files from public review." *Id.* Gamber-Johnson argues that there is a compelling reason to seal the exhibits as they contain customer information; product description; product specifications, including testing results of various products; proposed design changes to its products; business strategy information; financial information; sales and advertising information; budget forecasts; and annual budget information. (Resp. at 4-5.) Having reviewed the exhibits, the court agrees with Gamber-Johnson that the documents represent confidential business information that if made public could harm Gamber-Johnson. The court GRANTS the motion to seal (Dkt. # 83). Document numbers 89 and 90 shall remain under seal.
